### Talk About Literature in Kansas

Starting in February, the Manhattan Library Association will partner with the Kansas Humanities Council to bring a series of book discussions to the library. Experts will help to immerse readers in three captivating stories. This year's topic is "Contemporary Immigration."

Participants are invited to read the books in the series or simply attend the discussions. Everyone is welcome to attend these free events. Please register for each discussion on the library's website or by calling (785) 776-4741 ext.300, so that snacks may be provided.

Extra copies of each book will be available for check-out at the Reference Desk on the second floor of the Manhattan Public Library before and after the discussions.

The first selection is *Caramelo*, or, *Puro Cuento* by Sandra Cisneros, a semiautobiographical novel describing the experience of a Mexican-American family. Cisneros weaves themes of family and identity into a sweeping tale of American naturalization in which a young girl, Lala Reyes, navigates a web of family pride and practicality in the 1960s. The caramelo reboso – candy shawl – is Lala's sole memento of her dead mother. Like the weave of that shawl, Lala's tale recounts the complex life of a family always striving to put its best foot forward.

Starting at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 23, Nicolas Shump will lead the discussion of *Caramelo* in the Groesbeck Room at Manhattan Public Library. Nicolas teaches history and English at the Barstow School in Kansas City, Missouri.

Sandra Cisneros' publisher has been in contact with the library and there is a slight possibility she may be available to join the February discussion via video conference.
