What is cloud storage?




- Part of cloud computing
 - Access and use resources not on your computer or mobile device
- Cloud storage refers to storing your files in a data center
 - Ex. Documents, pictures, videos, music
- Useful for:
 - Backing up your files
 - Freeing up hard drive space
 - Accessing your files from multiple devices
 - Collaborating with others







- Let's you store files online
- 2GB of storage for free
 - Monthly and yearly subscriptions available for more storage
- Files are accessible from most devices with an internet connection
- Files are encrypted going to and coming from Dropbox
- Simple to use
- Can share large files that are too big to send via email
 - Can share home videos or entire photo albums
