## Annual Book Sale February 22 - 24

To make sure that no one is left out, memberships will be sold at the door starting at just \$10.

On Saturday, February 23, the book sale opens to the public from 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. with outstanding prices on used books, DVDs, audiobooks, CDs, and more.

On Sunday, February 24, the sale will be open from 1:00 - 3:30 p.m. with special deals on the remaining items. Fill a box or bag with books for only \$5.00.

## Pete Souza: Two Presidents, One Photographer

K-State's Marianna Kistler Beach Museum of Art will be the first venue for the traveling exhibition of photographs made by Pete Souza, Chief White House Photographer for Presidents Ronald Reagan and Barack Obama. The exhibit is scheduled for February 5 - April 27. Through the efforts of the Friends of the Beach Museum of Art, Mr. Souza will visit Manhattan March 5th and 6th.

Souza will tour the museum exhibition, join donors at a reception, and present a talk at McCain Auditorium on Tuesday, March 5th.

On Wednesday, March 6th, after meeting with K-State journalism and photography students, Pete Souza will conduct a book signing between noon and 1:00 at Manhattan Public Library! Bring your copy of Mr. Souza's books or purchase one on-site and take advantage of this singular opportunity to meet the photographer and get his signature on your book.

When Pete Souza visited Manhattan in October, 2017 to receive the Kansas State University Alumni Association's *Alumni Excellence Award*, he talked about his path to becoming the White House photographer. He originally studied at Boston University, where he took a photography class during his junior year, deciding that the "magic" of photography would be his life's pursuit. Upon leaving Boston University, he saw an advertisement from an ag/journalism professor at K-State who was looking for a graduate assistant.

He landed the job and began working for the *Collegian*, creating a portfolio of photographs that would earn him jobs at the *Hutchinson News*, the *Chanute Tribune* and eventually, the *Chicago Sun-Times*. While at the Sun-Times, he was tagged to do the official photography of President Reagan. At the end of the Reagan administration, Souza was a photographer for the Chicago Tribune's Washington Bureau. During that time, he was assigned to follow Barack Obama's first year as a U.S. Senator. Because the Obamas admired photos that Souza took of their family, he was offered the job as Official White House Photographer when Mr. Obama was elected President.



Pete Souza continues to be a freelance photographer in the Washington, D.C. area, and he serves as Professor Emeritus of Visual Communication at Ohio University. He has produced numerous photography books; his most recent works include: *Obama: An Intimate Portrait* and *Shade: A Tale of Two Presidents*.
